PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2013/14

The 2013/2014 cricket season was another successful year for St Ives Junior Cricket Club.

Based on the Club's junior cricket records dating back to 1964/1965, and a browsing review of the St Ives (Seniors) Cricket Club history, the Committee learned during the season that 2013/2014 was the 50th season of junior cricket in St Ives. A golden jubilee is a significant milestone in any Club's history, and a tribute to the parents and players who have supported the Club since the introduction of the Junior 'Schoolboy' Competition in the early 1960s.

In recognition of the Club's 50th Anniversary achievement, the Club is planning a celebration dinner to be held on 25 October 2014. I would like to thank Adele Brennan for her efforts in leading the planning for the event, and for accepting the role of Functions Coordinator for the Club.

Whilst this was the Club's 50th season, this was my first season as President, having taken over from Clive Fletcher, who, along with past-Treasurer Geoff Keevers, led the Club so magnificently for the previous five seasons. In recognition of their combined efforts, Clive and Geoff were awarded Life Membership of the Club at the Annual General Meeting in March 2013. Congratulations Clive and Geoff.

This year we had 580 players, up from 500 players the previous season. Our players were spread across 44 teams, consisting of 12 In2Cricket teams at the St Ives Village Green, four Little Breakers girls' teams on Friday evenings, one girls' team in the NSGCA, and 27 teams from U9s to U16/17 in the NSJCA.

On the field we had another strong season. Similar to last year, we had three minor premiership teams; namely U11 Haddin, U12/13 Haddin and U16/17 Border (This tells me we should name more teams 'Haddin'). As so often happens in knock out finals, however, only one team (U14/15 Hussey) secured a championship premiership, and one team (U13 Johnson) a cup win, with eight of our teams being runners up in either a championship, cup or plate final category. Congratulations to all of these teams.

The Club was well represented in the weekly NSJCA Nilgiri's sportsmanship awards, which are proudly sponsored by Nilgiri's Indian Restaurant in St Leonards. Congratulations to Max Black (U11 Haddin), Will Kennedy (U10 Lee), Ayush Vij (U11 Warner), Liam Skeggs (U14/15 Hussey) and Arthur Lockyer (U10 Lee) for their excellent sportsmanship.

The Club was again well represented in the NSJCA representative teams, with 28 players selected across the U10 to U16 age groups, and two players selected for the Cricket NSW Academy.

Sarah Turner and Lexi Bull from the Club did exceptionally well in the recent NSWPSSA girls cricket competition in Barooga. Sarah captained the team to their first win ever. Sarah was selected in the NSWPSSA Development team that will attend a three-day camp in April where the NSWPSSA team will be decided.

Rohan Rao (Under 13) also performed exceptionally well in the recent NSWPSSA boys cricket competition. Rohan's team, Sydney North, won the state championships for the second time in a row and Rohan has been part of both winning teams. Rohan also managed to take a hat trick for the second year in a row (against the same team as he did so last year)! A huge congratulations to Rohan for this amazing feat.

I would like to congratulate the following U10 and U11 players who were nominated for the President's Encouragement Award for their sportsmanship and commitment to cricket this season: Graham Page (U11 Haddin), Ben High (U11 Warner), Jackson Douglas (U11 Watson), Deshan Malalage (U11 Ponting), Josh Lewis (U11 Lyon), Lachlan Bill (U10 Lee), Alex Howard (U10 Clarke), Lachlan Hammersley (U10 Ponting) and Liam Husband (U10 Warner).

Based on the citations submitted by the team managers and coaches, all players would have been deserved winners. However, there can only be one winner, and I would like to congratulate Deshan Malalage (U11 Ponting) as this year's winner. Deshan's nomination citation is shown below:

"Throughout the season, Deshan has set the standard for our team in terms of his devotion to the game of cricket. He is a role model for the team for playing to the spirit of the game. He often offers advice and shares his knowledge with his team mates and always puts the team first when he plays. He sets a benchmark for his teammates to follow in terms of skill development by always giving his full attention throughout team training sessions, as well as the hours of practice that he puts in outside of the team sessions. He watches hours of YouTube cricket highlights to learn from International players and often reads cricket books to learn the history and technical aspects of the game. He also has demonstrated to the team that practice pays dividends as he rated highly in both the team batting and bowling statistics scoring 159 runs and taking 7 wickets for the season. Further, Deshan was selected to play in the NSJCA U10 rep team."

Congratulations Deshan.

In the NSGCA, the combined St Ives/Gordon girls Saturday team had another very successful season, which unfortunately came to a close when their semi-final was washed out. I would like to thank Steven Bird who took on the dual roles of U13 Age Coordinator and the NSGCA Coordinator.

This season saw a significant increase in our registrations for girl's cricket, which is tremendous. In addition to the Saturday competitions, this season saw the introduction of Friday evening cricket in Chatswood for 8 – 12 year old girls. Known as Little Breakers, this is an introductory style of cricket for girls being promoted by Cricket NSW. We managed to recruit 39 Girls for this comp which was a tremendous result, and from all reports they all thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

Under Mark Hilton, Matt Freeman and Steve Bartlett, the In2Cricket program had a brilliant year with over 150 kids on the Village Green every Saturday morning, up from 120 players the previous season. Steve did an excellent job arranging the team lists, whilst Mark and Matt did a

great job each week in their bright pink coordinator shirts and hats. David Ford and his team did an exceptional job in coordinating the cricketing development of our youngest players, and we look forward to their continued assistance with our In2Cricket program next season.

This year we introduced some new initiatives to promote player development, and from all reports, the specialised coaching sessions with David Ford and Daniel Caldwell were well

received. David Ford, a former Manly first grade player, conducted specialist coaching sessions at Hassell Park in batting, bowling, wicket keeping and a coach the coaches session on Wednesday afternoons, in addition to coordinating the In2Cricket activities at the Village Green each Saturday. Daniel Caldwell, a current first grade player with Northern Districts, attended at least one training session for each team with a view to 'coaching the coach'.

In April last year, the Club was approached for coaching and logistics assistance by the Regional Coordinator for the Active After School Communities Program (AASC) – a Federal Government funded program designed to get children active and create pathways into local sporting Clubs. As a result of the Club's support, Daniel Caldwell provided after school cricket activities at St Ives North Public School, St Ives Park, Gordon East Public School and Terry Hills Kids Club.

In September, the Club was approached for assistance in providing parents and players to appear with Australian test cricketers in a TV commercial for the Commonwealth Bank, which subsequently featured on TV during the summer of cricket. In appreciation for the Club's assistance, the Commonwealth Bank kindly donated \$4,000 to the Club, which the committee has decided to put towards the purchase of 20 gazebos for shade protection next season.

On Friday 15 November, the annual U9/U10 Big Bash social cricket / BBQ night was held at Hassell Park. Over 90 players across eight teams participated, and thankfully the weather held off long enough for all matches to be completed. Many thanks to Rachel Scholefield, Matt and Jacinda Cole, Katherine Stevenson, Trent Loebel and Julie Iyengar for helping with the night, and to Tri-Force Sports, David Ford coaching clinics and Geoff Spotswood coaching clinics for the lucky door prizes.

An interesting side note occurred on the night of the Big Bash. Daniel Caldwell was unavailable to conduct his 'coach the coach' session with U11 Haddin, and arranged for Scott Borthwick, his teammate from Northern Districts, to fill in whilst he was away. Scott, an English T20 and ODI representative player, was subsequently selected to play for England in the 5th Ashes Test in Sydney.

The Club continues to promote extra-curricular cricket activities for its players. For instance, in late December, 75 of our players participated in on ground activities at the SCG prior to a Sydney Sixers Big Bash Match, and were given complimentary tickets to the game as well. Congratulations to Mark Hilton for his organisational efforts in arranging this event. Some of our Little Breaker's girls were also lucky enough to participate in the on ground activities on the 3rd day of the Ashes Test at the SCG in January. They had a fabulous day decked out in pink for Jane McGrath day and even got to see the Aussies bowl out England to bring home the Ashes.

Prior to the Sydney Test, the Club checked with Cricket NSW whether the general public could watch the Australian and English teams practice in the days leading up to the Test, and learned that spectators were welcome to attend the training session, free of charge, and have the opportunity to speak to the players, obtain autographs and have photos with the stars. Several families amongst the Club took up the opportunity, and had an excellent experience close up with the Aussie and English players. Having taken my two boys along this year, I would certainly recommend it for everyone next season.

In February, the Club arranged for 100 of our players to play social cricket on the SCG during the lunch break on Day 4 of the Sheffield Shield match between New South Wales and Victoria. The SCG kindly offered to open the SCG Museum especially for our visit, and plans were underway for a tour of the newly opened MA Noble and Don Bradman Grandstands. Unfortunately, the match finished a day early, courtesy of Victoria slumping from 3 for 0 to 6 for 9 in its second innings (and subsequently losing by an innings). Despite not proceeding this year, I would encourage the plans be dusted off and resurrected again next year. There was strong enthusiasm amongst parents and players for the SCG visit, and I would like to thank everyone who volunteered to assist as coordinators.

One initiative the Club is currently investigating is the concept of participation based, or Average Cricket, for our Under 10 Division 2 and Under 11 Division 2 players. Having a strong interest in cricket statistics, it was apparent when I read last year's Annual Report that there are many players who would benefit from having a set number of overs at the crease (when batting) instead of the Out means Out rule that currently applies from Under 10s upwards. A follow up review of this season's statistics, and the then a review of batting statistics over the past eight seasons across all clubs in the NSJCA for Under 10s (2,200 players) and Under 11s (2,000 players) indicates there is merit in trialling the participation format next season for U10s.

An online survey was distributed in February to parents of Under 9s through to Under 12s, seeking feedback on their cricket experience this season, and asking for feedback on the proposed introduction of Average Cricket next season. The initial feedback suggests there is support for the concept in Under 10s, and limited support for Under 11s. The concept has been raised as a discussion point for upcoming NSJCA planning meetings for season 2014/2015.

I would like to record my sincere thanks to everyone on the committee for their combined efforts in making the season such a success. The committee is comprised of a dedicated group of very capable parent volunteers, each of whom provides excellent service to the Club. Believe it or not, planning for the season began in May, with April being the only month without a committee meeting.

One aspect of the Club I would like to acknowledge is the willingness of parents to assist the Club in its various endeavours. A perfect example was the response for volunteers to run the BBQ for the Grand Opening of the St Ives IGA located across the road from Hassell Park. To put the request in context, I received a phone call on the Friday afternoon prior to the Australia Day long weekend from Sasha, the Store Manager, asking for assistance with the BBQ on the Saturday as another sporting club had become unavailable at the last minute. I promised to send a Club-wide email to parents asking for assistance, and the response was overwhelming – either from people

able to assist, or from people sending apology emails from near and far expressing their willingness to assist except for being away. As a result of the request, the Club made \$150, and IGA has kindly offered to assist with supplies for our BBQ on Presentation Day.

I would like to thank our major sponsor, Triforce Sports for all that they do for us – not only offering our members 10% discount all year round, but for their help with donations for various lucky door prizes throughout the season. We are also thankful to Papa's Pizza and Pasta in St Ives Shopping Village for donating milkshake vouchers for player of the day awards and Sydney

Awards and Trophies in West Lindfield for the wonderful support they give us. We are always on the lookout for additional sponsors for the Club and hope to make inroads in adding to our sponsorship base next season.

I would like to thank the Age Coordinators who collectively did a fantastic job in coordinating the many and varied activities required to keep a junior cricket Club running smoothly. Our Age Coordinators this year were Katherine Stevenson (U9), Julie Iyengar (U10), Matt Cole (U11), Lara Turner (U12), Stephen Bird (U13), Chris Skeggs (U14/15) and Lalin De Silva (U16/17).

I would like to thank Dean Beeton who kindly volunteered at the beginning of the season to fill the vacant position of Club Coaching Coordinator. Dean was passionate (in his measured way) in trialling the provision of specialised coaching for all players in each team (at a subsidised rate) as opposed to only two players in each team (completely subsidised by the Club) as had been in place in recent years. The high participation rates amongst our players would indicate the specialised coaching trial was a complete success and should be continued next season.

I would like to pay particular thanks to our Club Operations Manager, Rachel Scholefield, who once again provided excellent and dedicated service to the Club, and often going well beyond the call of duty to ensure the smooth running of Club activities.

In recognition of her efforts, Rachel was awarded the Cricket NSW Sydney North Region Club Volunteer of the Year at an awards ceremony held at the SCG in January. The citation on the certificate read as follows:

"Rachel has been successfully involved in junior Cricket at St Ives for years and her enthusiasm and countless hours of hard work should not go unnoticed. Rachel was also one of the key contributors to getting the very successful inaugural Little Breakers League junior girls completion off the ground."

Congratulations Rachel.

I would also like to thank Matt Cole, our new Treasurer, who took over the reins from Geoff Keevers with distinction. Matt's diligence in budgeting, record keeping and Club accounting was exemplary, and was matched by his enthusiasm and skill in cooking sausages on the Club BBQ. Thanks Matt for a job well done.

I would like to thank Anthony Ford for his continued efforts as Equipment Officer. Anthony did a great job checking the equipment in each kit prior to the start of the season, and ordering replacement items as required.

I would like to thank Chris Skeggs, the Club's delegate on the NSJCA committee for his time and effort in attending the monthly NSJCA meetings, and reporting back to the committee at our monthly meetings. Chris' calm and reasoned response to my various questions throughout the season was greatly appreciated.

For a number of seasons, the position of Vice President has been vacant, and as a result, the workload on the President has been particularly busy this year. Ideally, I would like to see a team

of three co-Vice Presidents to share the workload when addressing the many and varied items that arise in a season.

Considering the busy workload this season (despite my assurances that it wouldn't be too much of an impost on the family) I would particularly like to thank my wife, Jacqui, and our children, Tom, Charlie and Alice for their tremendous support and patience during the season.

Finally, as noted in previous years by past presidents, I would like to re-iterate that the single most important aspect for St Ives Junior Cricket Club's existence is for every player to participate and to have a 'fair go'. This requires a team of managers and coaches that can provide the environment for this to be possible. We do not grade teams, we believe in playing for the love of the game, as much as possible with the people you want to play with. This inevitably leads to teams having variable skill levels.

I would like to thank every coach, manager, assistant, part-time assistant, scorer and umpire from every team for the time they take every week to make sure the players have the opportunity to participate. Without this approach there is no doubt the game would not be as widely enjoyed as it is.

As Clive Fletcher mentioned in his President's Report last year, as a Club, 'we want to measure our success by how many kids comeback rather than by how many trophies we win'.

With this in mind, I wish you all the best for your winter activities, and look forward to seeing you again next summer.

ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA

Awards are based on performances throughout the normal competition rounds. **Semi-Finals and Finals performances are not included for the purpose of determining awards.**

Perpetual awards are to be held by registered members of the Club only. Perpetual trophies shall be returned to the Club Registrar immediately a player ceases being a registered member of the Club, or at the end of the following season prior to Presentation Day.

JOHN WALSH MEMORIAL TROPHY (Club Champion): Awarded to the player who achieves the highest point score for the season (1 point per run scored, 10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or run-out, 5 points per assisted run-out). All age groups are eligible.

(Note: This trophy shall be held by a player once only; a player who has won the trophy once and scores the most points in a subsequent season will be acknowledged appropriately by the Club).

J. MAUNDER CUP: Presented to the player who scores the most runs in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players score equal runs, the award will be shared.

CHARLTON CUP: Presented to the player who takes the most wickets in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players take an equal number of wickets, the award will be shared.

BARRY GARROD TROPHY: Presented to the player who achieves the highest batting average in U11 and U12. A minimum aggregate of 200 runs must be scored for U12, and 150 for U11.

NEIL MARTZ TROPHY: Presented to the best performing wicket keeper for the season (total of catches and stumpings). All age groups are eligible.

PRESIDENT'S ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD: Presented to the player who is considered to have displayed the greatest dedication to the game, to the Club, and in developing their skills in the U10 and U11 competition. The Award is determined by the Club Executive on advice from each of the eligible team manager's recommendations.

STEVE DANIELS MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented to the player judged to be the most promising in the Club, ready to play in the senior competition. It has been traditional to select a player from the Club's most senior teams, and the Committee when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time. All aspects of the game are considered including batting, bowling, fielding, captaincy, sportsmanship and contribution to the Club.

JOHNSON FAMILY AWARD (sponsored by Northern Districts Cricket Club): Presented to the player judged to be the most promising playing in the U14/15 competition. The Committee, when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time, including performance in Representative cricket. In addition to a perpetual trophy the recipient receives a scholarship for the Northern District Cricket Academy for the following season.

ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA (cont)

TRIFORCE GIRL'S CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY: Awarded to the female player who achieves the highest point score for the season (10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or runout, 1 point per run scored). All age groups playing Girl's only cricket are eligible.

HAT TRICKS and 5 WICKETS IN A GAME: trophies are awarded to individuals who take a hat trick or 5 wickets in a game during the season.

BATTING and BOWLING AWARDS: are made to the highest aggregate run scorers and wicket takers in each team. If players are equal on aggregate, the best average is awarded the trophy.

MANAGER'S AWARDS: are awarded to the player who has played the game with the best "spirit of cricket" – the best all round, team player. To be decided by the Manager and/or Coach of each U10-U16/17 team.

U9's AWARDS: Each U9 team is awarded a Player of the Year award (for the best all round player) and a Best Team Player award (for the player who has played with the best "spirit of cricket"). These awards are decided by the Coach and/or Manager of each team.

OTHER AWARDS: Medallions are awarded to all members of Minor Premiers and Premiership winning teams by the association. The Club also awards Minor Premier caps to each team member of Minor Premier teams (teams finishing on top of the table before the finals begin).

REPRESENTATIVE CRICKET

All financial juniors playing for St Ives Junior Cricket Club are eligible to trial for the representative team in their age group. Our Club had another strong representation in this Season's North Shore Junior Cricket Association representative teams.

Each year, cricket associations from all parts of Sydney, Newcastle, Wollongong and the ACT enter teams in the NSW Districts Junior Shield representative competitions (DCA).

The Inter District Cricket Association (IDCA) runs a competition designed to give players with potential the opportunity to play the game at a level between the Associations' and NSW Districts' standards.

Cricket NSW Academy Program: The Cricket NSW Academy is an off season development program run for ages 13-16 across NSW.

Little Breakers

On the 13th June last year, CricketNSW approached our Club with a very exciting proposal: In conjunction with the NSGCA (North Shore Girls' Cricket Association), they were interested in starting up a "beginner" girls only comp and trialling this initiative on the Lower North Shore.

With much excitement, we jumped at the opportunity. We have felt that there has been a huge gap in the market for young girls interested in pursuing the sport after In2Cricket, particularly with the inspirational success of the Australian Women's cricket team.

In order for this initiative to be successful, CricketNSW and the NSGCA really needed the support of the Clubs. We were extremely proud and excited to recruit 4 full teams of 8 girls per team to submit into this inaugural competition which became branded as The Little Breaker's League.

The comp is for girls aged between 8-12 years old (no age division between teams, so sisters/friends can play together in the same team regardless of age). Each Friday from Oct-Dec last year (5.30-7pm at Bales Park, Chatswood), teams of 8 girls played 2 games each: 8 overs per side. The rules are similar to Under 9's average cricket: each pair bats for 2 overs each and each player bowls for one over per game. In the Bales Park Comp there were 8 teams from St Ives, Gordon and North Sydney. There was also a Mosman comp and a Belrose comp with 20 teams competing overall.

We put together a lovely uniform for the girls and Cricket NSW provided head-bands and coloured zinc which were a great hit. The sun shone and popular background music made for a wonderful atmosphere—with the girls often being seen dancing or cartwheeling between overs.

The girls were also lucky enough to have been treated to a training session from the NSW Lend Lease Breakers half way through the season.

By the end of the 10 week season, our St Ives numbers had grown to 39 – we even had one girl walking her dog with her family make enquiries and as one team was short that particular night, we gave her a spare shirt and she joined the team for the rest of the season! And in February, some of the older Little Breaker's had a practise game with our St Gordon girl's team (the natural next step up) and a few joined them for the remainder of their season. Two of our Little Breakers even made it into the U13 NSGCA Rep team, having barely faced a hard ball before in their lives!

We are so proud to have been one of the start-up Clubs in this exciting initiative. CricketNSW now have plans to roll out the concept across the whole of NSW for season 2014/15. We have no doubt that it will continue to be successful in our area and many other areas across the country into the future. Who knows, perhaps one of these initial Little Breakers will play in the Australian Women's team one day. Watch this space!
