#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT – 2012-2013 SEASON

Firstly, thank you to everyone who assisted in running the club this year. Particular thanks to our Club Operations Manager, Rachel Scholefield, who has been absolutely fantastic in helping run the club so smoothly over this last year. Rachel has been so enthusiastic with all of her organising, communicating (especially our new newsletters), fundraising etc. This year, the number of registered players was down to around 500. Hopefully numbers will pick up again next season as everyone spreads the word on what a great club we have.

On the field we had a pretty good season. We had 3 minor premiership teams and they all went on to win the Championship (with U10 Watson having a thrilling draw to end their season). Congratulations to U10 Watson, U11 Hussey and U12 Johnson.

On the representative front, two current and one ex St Ives player have featured in NSW age group selections. Kieran Jayasekera and Nick Badings both gained selection for the NSW U15 team that completed in Perth in February. In addition, a past Steve Daniels award winner, Reagan Klemt was selected to play in the all age NSW Schoolboys team. Another past Steve Daniels award winner, Harry Conway, played in the U19 World Cup team in Nepal.

St Ives was well represented in the NSJCA rep comps this last season, with 2 DCA teams (U10 and U14) winning their competitions. One very impressive achievement this year – in his second year in U10 and for the second time, Rohan Rao received the NSW DCA Bowling Award.

The Club again had girls playing in the Northern Sydney Girls Cricket Association competition under the combined St Ives/Gordon banner – St Gordon. The competition was strong and our squad of 14 were a particularly young team but they performed with great valour and pride each week. Two St Ives girls, Philippa Carey and Sarah Turner, were selected to compete in the CIS U13 competition and also in the U13 NSW DCA comp. They were in the winning side in both competitions.

Under David McKay, the In2Cricket program had another brilliant year with around 120 kids on the Village Green every Saturday morning. Geoff Spotswood and his coaching team continue to support the club at this level and do a fantastic job.

Overall it was a great season, with a little less impact of hot weather or rain (well until the finals!). It was great to get so much positive feedback about how much the boys and girls enjoyed their cricket.

I would again like to thank David Ford for his support in running sessions for the older teams as well as the "coach the coaches" session. The addition of team clinics as well as our traditional specialist batting, bowling and wicket keeping clinics, were very popular and appreciated. David received tremendous feedback and we do hope to continue his association with the club.

The introduction of a Friday night Twilight U9/U10 Big Bash session was a welcome addition to the calendar, for both the parents and the kids. I am sure this will now become an annual event.

Paul Byrom from Triforce Sports also continues to provide fantastic support to the club and again facilitated the introduction to cricket clinic for the U9 and U10 group early in the season.

This is my last year as president and I will be handing over the reins at the end of this season. After 5 years in this role, I still think the key strength around St Ives Junior Cricket Club is that we have always emphasised that every player be able to participate and be given a "fair go". I do know that most coaches and managers follow this philosophy and because of this everyone enjoys their cricket so much more. We do want to measure our success by how many kids come back rather than by how many trophies we win.

On that note, I would like to thank every committee member, coach, manager, assistant, part-time assistant, umpire and scorer from every team for the time they take every week to make sure that the players have the opportunity to participate.

#### ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA

Awards are based on performances throughout the normal competition rounds. **Semi-Finals** and **Finals** performances are not included for the purpose of determining awards.

Perpetual awards are to be held by registered members of the Club only. Perpetual trophies shall be returned to the Club Registrar immediately a player ceases being a registered member of the Club, or at the end of the following season prior to Presentation Day.

**JOHN WALSH MEMORIAL TROPHY:** Awarded to the player who achieves the highest point score for the season (10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or runout (shared between players involved), 1 point per run scored). All age groups are eligible.

(Note: This trophy shall be held by a player once only; a player who has won the trophy once and scores the most points in a subsequent season will be acknowledged appropriately by the Club).

**J. MAUNDER CUP:** Presented to the player who scores the most runs in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players score equal runs, the award will be shared.

**CHARLTON CUP:** Presented to the player who takes the most wickets in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players take an equal number of wickets, the award will be shared.

**BARRY GARROD TROPHY:** Presented to the player who achieves the highest batting average in U11 and U12. A minimum aggregate of 200 runs must be scored for U12, and 150 for U11.

**NEIL MARTZ TROPHY:** Presented to the best performing wicket keeper for the season (total of catches and stumpings). All age groups are eligible.

**PRESIDENT'S ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD:** Presented to the player who is considered to have displayed the greatest dedication to the game, to the Club, and in developing their skills in the U10 and U11 competition. The Award is determined by the Club Executive on advice from each of the eligible team manager's recommendations.

**STEVE DANIELS MEMORIAL TROPHY:** Presented to the player judged to be the most promising in the Club, ready to play in the senior competition. It has been traditional to select a player from the Club's most senior teams, and the Committee when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time. All aspects of the game are considered including batting, bowling, fielding, captaincy, sportsmanship and contribution to the Club.

JOHNSON FAMILY AWARD (sponsored by Northern Districts Cricket Club): Presented to the player judged to be the most promising playing in the U14/15 competition. The Committee, when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time, including performance in Representative cricket. In addition to a perpetual trophy the recipient receives a scholarship for the Northern District Cricket Academy for the following season.

**TRIFORCE GIRL'S CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY:** Awarded to the female player who achieves the highest point score for the season (10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or runout, 1 point per run scored). All age groups are eligible.

**HAT TRICKS and 5 WICKETS IN A GAME:** trophies are awarded to individuals who take a hat trick or 5 wickets in a game during the season.

**BATTING and BOWLING AWARDS:** are made to the highest aggregate run scorers and wicket takers in each team. If players are equal on aggregate, the best average is awarded the trophy.

**MANAGER'S AWARDS:** are awarded to the player who has played the game with the best "spirit of cricket" – the best all round, team player. To be decided by the Manager and/or Coach of each U10-U16/17 team.

**U9's AWARDS:** Each U9 team is awarded a Player of the Year award (for the best all round player) and a Best Team Player award (for the player who has played with the best "spirit of cricket"). These awards are decided by the Coach and/or Manager of each team.

**OTHER AWARDS:** Medallions are awarded to all members of Minor Premiers and Premiership winning teams by the association. The Club also awards Minor Premier caps to each team member of Minor Premier teams (teams finishing on top of the table before the finals begin).

#### REPRESENTATIVE CRICKET

All financial juniors playing for St Ives Junior Cricket Club are eligible to trial for the representative team in their age group. Our Club had another strong representation in this Season's North Shore District Junior Cricket representative teams.

Each year, cricket associations from all parts of Sydney, Newcastle, Wollongong and the ACT enter teams in the NSW Districts Junior Shield representative competitions (DCA).

The Inter District Cricket Association (IDCA) runs a competition designed to give players with potential the opportunity to play the game at a level between the Associations' and NSW Districts' standards.

Cricket NSW Academy Program: The Cricket NSW Academy is an off season development program run for ages 13-16 across NSW.

Oskar Hicks – Oskar was one of the younger members of squad. He trained hard and certainly gave his all whenever it was asked of him. He played with a straight bat as the summer progressed, and finished the season looking most accomplished. The off-drive he played at Waverton just before Christmas will be remembered for its crisp, textbook execution. The undoubted highlight of Oskar's season was his bowling in the Grand Final. In his first over he claimed two vital wickets that put the game beyond doubt for us.

**Nick Hook** - Nick is one of the most talented nine year old cricketers I have seen. It is worth noting that he qualified to play U9 cricket this season, but was a stand out performer in our Championship winning U11 team. He bats with a technique and authority beyond his years. His lack of height often posed a problem for him on the bouncy artificial wickets, but he adapted well by scoring heavily with a lofted cut he developed early on in the season. His bowling was also of the highest calibre. He hit a great length with his leg spin and regularly got the ball above the batsman's eye line. Remember his name. You'll hear it in years to come.

**Sam Bull** – Sam was the ever enthusiastic, determined member of the team. His bowling improved steadily over the summer, and he responded well to Jeremy's coaching. When he keeps his head up and follows through, he's as effective as any bowler. He showed this in the Grand Final. Sam's primary virtue is that he is the consummate team man. He took his role very seriously and never stopped working hard for his mates. We were very lucky to have him in our team.

**Gregor Dingley** – Gregor's cricket improved tremendously over the summer. He scored heavily with the bat and bowled leg spin with authority. He spent a lot of time in the nets this summer, working on all aspects of his game. The effort paid dividends and was reflected in his overall performance. Gregor's team focus and natural flair for leadership resulted in him being appointed captain in the second half of the season and saw him lead the team to another Minor Premiership and Grand Final victory.

Harrison Ferry - Harrison has developed into a fabulous wicket keeper, which served him and the team so well throughout the summer. His keen eye and good foot movement behind the stumps suggest that he has a strong future ahead of him as a glove man. Appropriately, he's a worthy winner of the NSJCA wicket keeping prize having taken seven catches and two stumpings over the summer. His innings under pressure in the Grand Final was the finest he's played for our team, and suggests that he has what seasoned first class cricketers know simply as 'the bottle'. In addition to all this, he bowled full and straight all summer.

**Ashton Smith** - Ashton made a solid contribution to the team this season. He worked hard to get the best out of an unconventional bowling action, and played his role as a pinch hitter to perfection when required. His 2 wickets against Mosman in the T20 fixture was a particular highlight of his season. He will need to continue to develop his technical skills across all aspects

of his game, but with focus and commitment he will keep on getting better.

Jay Mace – Every team has a journeyman. Jay is ours. He's the boy who took what talent he had, and through hard work and net time, turned it into so much more than anyone expected. No one is more deserving of the title of leading wicket taker in a champion team. He bowled straight and took two or more wickets on five separate occasions over the course of the summer. It was a wonderful effort by any standard. As the opposition gets better he will need to bowl flatter and quicker if he wants to keep taking wickets, but for now, he can enjoy some richly deserved recognition for a job well done.

**Stuart Dingley** - Stuart finished the season as the leading run scorer in the competition for the second year running. It's a tremendous achievement for a young lad, and one of which he can be very proud. His consistency with the bat generally meant that the team scored heavily each week. His strength and aggressive approach allowed him to blend attractive stroke play and brute force to good effect. Stuart bowled quickly throughout the summer and to good effect, although he will need to concentrate on bowling fuller if he wants to take wickets more consistently in the older age groups.

President Clive Fletcher welcomed all present and thanked the Club Executive, Managers, Coaches and parents for all their efforts in keeping the Club running smoothly throughout a very successful season.

Minutes from the 2011 Annual General Meeting were covered in the Annual report, and copies were made available to all attendees prior to the meeting. The minutes were taken as read, and there were no matters arising.

The President's Report was tabled in the Annual Report available to attendees, and was taken as read. Clive Fletcher pointed out the main part of his report that he would like to stress is the appeal for new volunteers which the Club needs going forward to ensure continued success.

## President's Report 2012/13

Firstly, thank you to everyone who assisted in running the club this year. Particular thanks to our Club Operations Manager, Rachel Scholefield, who has been absolutely fantastic in helping run the club so smoothly over this last year. Rachel has been so enthusiastic with all of her organising, communicating (especially our new newsletters), fundraising etc.

This year, the number of registered players was down to around 500. Hopefully numbers will pick up again next season as everyone spreads the word on what a great club we have.

On the field we had a pretty good season. We had 3 minor premiership teams and they all went on to win the Championship (with U10 Watson having a thrilling draw to end their season). Congratulations to U10 Watson, U11 Hussey and U12 Johnson.

On the representative front, two current and one ex St Ives player have featured in NSW age group selections. Kieran Jayasekera and Nick Badings both gained selection for the NSW U15 team that completed in Perth in February. In addition, a past Steve Daniels award winner, Reagan Klemt was selected to play in the all age NSW Schoolboys team. Another past Steve Daniels award winner, Harry Conway, played in the U19 World Cup team in Nepal.

St Ives was well represented in the NSJCA rep comps this last season, with 2 DCA teams (U10 and U14) winning their competitions. One very impressive achievement this year – in his second year in U10 and for the second time, Rohan Rao received the NSW DCA Bowling Award.

The Club again had girls playing in the Northern Sydney Girls Cricket Association under the combined St Ives/Gordon banner – St Gordon. The competition was strong and our squad of 14 were a particularly young team but they performed with great valour and pride each week. Two St Ives girls, Philippa Carey and Sarah Turner, were selected to compete in the CIS U13 comp and also in the U13 NSW DCA comp. They were in the winning side in both competitions.

Under David McKay, the In2Cricket program had another brilliant year with around 120 kids on the Village Green every Saturday morning. Geoff Spotswood and his coaching team continue to support the club at this level and do a fantastic job.

Overall it was a great season, with a little less impact of hot weather or rain (well until the finals!). It was great to get so much positive feedback about how much the boys and girls enjoyed their cricket.

I would again like to thank David Ford for his support in running sessions for the older teams as well as the "coach the coaches" session. The addition of team clinics as well as our traditional specialist batting, bowling and wicket keeping clinics, were very popular and appreciated. David received tremendous feedback and we do hope to continue his association with the club.

The introduction of a Friday night Twilight U9/U10 Big Bash session was a welcome addition to the calendar, for both the parents and the kids. I am sure this will now become an annual event.

Paul Byrom from Triforce Sports also continues to provide fantastic support to the club and again facilitated the introduction to cricket clinic for the U9 and U10 group early in the season.

This is my last year as president and I will be handing over the reins at the end of this season. After 5 years in this role, I still think the key strength around St Ives Junior Cricket Club is that we have always emphasised that every player be able to participate and be given a "fair go". I do know that most coaches and managers follow this philosophy and because of this everyone enjoys their cricket so much more. We do want to measure our success by how many kids come back rather than by how many trophies we win.

On that note, I would like to thank every committee member, coach, manager, assistant, parttime assistant, umpire and scorer from every team for the time they take every week to make sure that the players have the opportunity to participate.

#### 1 Statement of significant accounting policies

The significant policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report are:

#### a Basis of preparation

The association is a non-reporting entity and the financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for the committee members and members of the St Ives District Junior Cricket Club Inc. for the purpose of fulfilling the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1984. The Financial Statements comply with those Accounting Standards and UIG Consensus Views (if any) deemed necessary by the committee in the circumstances to meet the objectives of the special purpose financial report including:

AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 110 Events after Balance Date

AASB 124 Related Party Disclosures

AASB 1031 Materiality

AASB 1048 Interpretation and Application of Standards

They have been prepared from historical cost records and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated, current valuations of non-current assets. The accounting policies have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

It has been determined that it is unnecessary to include a Statement of Cash Flows to meet the objectives of the special purpose financial report.

Notes to and forming part of the financial statements (continued) For the year ended 28 February 2013

#### b Revenue recognition

Membership revenue is recognised in the period to which it relates. Sales of goods are recognised at the time of sale to the customer.

Other income is recognised when received.

#### c Expenses

Expenses were recorded in the financial statements on an accruals basis so that expenses are matched against income and recognised in the year to which they relate.

#### d Inventories

Inventories comprise stocks of cricket balls held for future use and club shirts and hats held for resale. Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### e Property, plant and equipment

Items of cricket equipment are initially recorded at cost and depreciated over their estimated useful lives.

#### f Goods and services tax

In a previous financial year the association elected to cancel its registration under the goods and services tax (GST) as its turnover was below the threshold for mandatory registration. After the cancellation of the associations GST registration, revenues, expenses and assets are recognised inclusive of GST where applicable. Prior to cancellation revenues, expenses and assets were recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In these circumstances the GST was recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense.

Accruals are stated inclusive of GST. There is no outstanding amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO.
