PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2014/15

Season 2014/2015 has been another highly successful year for St Ives District Junior Cricket Club.

We had 598 players this season, up from 580 players in 2013/2014 and 500 players in 2012/2013.

Our players were spread across 47 teams, consisting of three T20 Blast girls' teams on Friday evenings, 10 In2Cricket teams at the St Ives Village Green on Saturday morning, one girls' team in the Breakers Junior Cricket League (BJCL), and 33 teams from U9s to U16/17 in the North Shore Junior Cricket Association (NSJCA).

In the U9 age group alone, we had 107 players spread across eight teams. Over 80% of the U9 players had played in2Cricket with the Club in 2013/2014, which is a strong indication of the success of the In2cricket program in preparing young players for junior cricket.

On the field we had another strong season. We had two minor premierships teams; namely U12/13 Haddin and U13 Perry, and both teams secured the premiership. In other matches, U12 Clarke and U13 Lee won their 'Cup' finals, and U10 Average Warner and U16/17 Trumper won their 'Plate' finals, with eight of our teams being runners up in either a Cup, Plate or Bowl final category. Congratulations to all of these teams.

This season we welcomed Michael Doran of McGrath Estate Agents in St Ives as our principal sponsor for the 2014/15 and beyond. On top of a very generous financial contribution, the Club will receive 10% of any commission on any properties sold which have been referred to Michael by a member of the St Ives Junior Cricket Club. This offer also includes referrals from family and friends of Club members. We intend to put the bulk of these sponsorship dollars into improving/increasing our coaching commitment at the Club which we feel will be a fantastic investment in the Club's future.

A Pre-Season Club day was held for the first time at Hassall Park on Sunday 14th September from 2.30-5pm. Former Australian cricketer, Jason Krejza, was the star attraction, and impressed everybody by knocking over the stumps first time during the centre wicket bowling competition. There was a free sausage sizzle (thanks to McGrath!) as well as our annual Under 9 Intro to Cricket clinic. All team kits were collected from the Louise Smith kit room (including all in2cricket kits), and the Annual Coaches and Managers information session was conducted in the clubhouse. We also had uniform sales and kit collections as well as an "equipment swap" table. The event was a massive success, and effectively combined several events into one.

This season will be remembered for the tragic passing of Phillip Hughes, which touched the cricket and wider community all around the world. The way the community responded to the accident was inspirational. I'd like to thank all parents on the way that Phillip's passing was explained to our young players, and the respectful moments of reflection before the games on 29/30 November. I'd also like to congratulate Ashley Eksteen, the coach of U9 Hughes, for the way he spoke when interviewed on radio 2UE. Amongst other things, Ashley mentioned that the team had decided it would like to continue playing as team Hughes in future seasons as it moves through the age groups.



In February, the Club celebrated 50 years of junior cricket in the St Ives district with a dinner dance for 140 people at Terrey Hills Golf Club. Guests included parents from 17 teams, former committee members and past parents. One of the highlights of the night was listening to Mr Kersi Meher-Homji, a past parent and a renowned cricket author, recount his days as the scorer of his son's U12 team in 1989/90. Another highlight was the 50th anniversary cake in the shape of a St Ives cricket shirt. I'd like to thank Adele Brennan, our functions coordinator, for her efforts in organising the event, and everyone who attended to celebrate 50 years of junior cricket in St Ives.



As mentioned in last season's report, all the trophies in our trophy cabinet were awarded for the first time in 1964/65 – hence the reason for celebrating the 50th anniversary this season. However, we discovered during the season that the St Ives Cricket Club participated in the inaugural junior cricket competition conducted by the Hornsby Cricket Association in 1937/38 (it dropped out after four rounds), and operated on a stop-start-stop-start basis for the next 24

years before resuming in 1961/1962 and competing unabated ever since. Who knows, next year we might celebrate our 75th anniversary!

The Club was well represented in the weekly NSJCA Nilgiri's sportsmanship awards, which are proudly sponsored by Nilgiri's Indian Restaurant in St Leonards. Congratulations to Harrison Davis (U12 Warner), Ben Heazelwood (U12 Clarke), Jamie Ashton (U12 Johnson), Justus Stals (U13 North) and Kevyn Lockyer (Coach of U11 Lee) for their excellent sportsmanship.

The Club was again well represented in the NSJCA representative teams, with 31 players selected across the U10 to U16 age groups, up from 28 players last season. We also had six players selected for the Cricket NSW Academy.

During the January holidays, four girls from our Club: Ciara Gibson, Stella Campbell, Sarah Turner and Lexi Bull were selected into the North East Galaxy Warriors Team for the U13 Mollie Dive Junior Breakers Rep Carnival. Sarah Turner captained the team, and Stella Campbell was vice-captain. The team won all seven of their T20's to beat Newcastle in the final and win the carnival. Sarah was awarded Player of the Tournament.



I would like to congratulate the following U10 and U11 players who were nominated for the President's Encouragement Award for their sportsmanship and commitment to cricket this season: Anthony Bartlett (U10 Ponting), Peter Xegas (U10 Watson), Charlie Schell (U10 Smith), Josh Botha (U10 Clarke), David Kim (U10 Pattinson), Callum Weir (U10 Warner), Alexander Guilday (U11 Ponting), Henry Day (U11 Lee) and Tom Coughlin (Under 11 Clarke)

Based on the citations submitted by the team managers and coaches, all players would have been deserved winners. However, there can only be one winner, and I would like to congratulate Alexander Guilday (U11 Ponting) as this year's winner. Alex's nomination citation is shown below:

"Alex excelled in both batting and bowling for U11 Ponting, and held excellent rankings in the overall division's statistics. His dedication to the team and the game was shown by attending every training session and all but one match (he was at a World Cup game for the match he missed). His Achilles' heel was sometimes his over-enthusiasm, but during the season he worked hard to temper it, while continuing to be competitive and an encouraging voice on the field in a true spirit of sportsmanship."

Some great statistics were notched up in season 2014/15. Notably Rohan Rao's 149 not out in round 4. This represents the highest score in the club's nine year MyCricket history. A great knock Rohan! His team mate, Thomas Elliott, also managed to score a century (110) in round 10. Nick Hook (U13 Perry) managed to take 8/15 in his U11 President's Cup rep match on 30th November. Well done Nick.

In the BJCL, we fielded a fully-fledged U15 St Ives girls Saturday team for the first time in many seasons, compared to previous seasons when we've had combined St Ives/Gordon teams. The girls celebrated a few wins even though they were a very young team and they built up a great team spirit and had a lot of fun on Saturday afternoons. I would like to thank Steven Bird who took on the role of Girls' Cricket Coordinator once again.

This season saw a significant increase in our registrations for girl's cricket, which is tremendous. In addition to the Saturday afternoon competition, this season saw the continuation of the Friday evening 20/20 cricket in Chatswood for 8 – 12 year old girls. Rebranded as 'T20 Blast Girls', this is an introductory style of cricket for girls being promoted by Cricket NSW.

Cricket NSW also ran a T20 Blast mixed centre at St Ives Village Green on Friday evenings in Feb/March this year. With over 40 participants, this was deemed a successful venture. A huge thanks to Josh Turner from the Club (U14/15 Haddin) for volunteering to help out with the skills zone. We hear that Josh enjoyed himself as well and has been invited to also help out CricketNSW with their T20Blast school holiday program at the SCG. The general idea is that after a taste of cricket in the T20 Blast format, we will be able to convert these players into Club cricket for next season. Also, with the huge success of the Big Bash League over the past few years, we do feel that we need to embrace this style of cricket and incorporate it into our Clubs offerings.

Under Steven Levin, Matt Freeman and Steve Bartlett, the In2Cricket program had a brilliant year with over 130 kids on the Village Green every Saturday morning, down from 150 players the previous season (most of whom played U9s this season). Steve Bartlett did an excellent job arranging the team lists, whilst Steven Levin and Matt did a great job each week in their bright pink coordinator shirts and hats. David Ford (head coach) and his team did an exceptional job in coordinating the cricketing development of our youngest players, and we look forward to their continued assistance with our In2Cricket program next season.



This season we continued the initiative we introduced last season to promote player development, and from all reports, the specialised coaching sessions with David Ford and Daniel

Caldwell were well received. David Ford, a former Manly first grade player, conducted specialist coaching sessions at Hassall Park in batting, bowling, wicket keeping and a coach the coaches session on Wednesday afternoons, in addition to coordinating the In2Cricket activities at the Village Green each Saturday. Daniel Caldwell, a current first grade player with Northern Districts, attended at least one training session for each team with a view to tailoring specialist sessions for each team in areas where they needed it most whilst also emphasizing a 'coaching the coach' strategy.

This season we introduced a new format for all U9 and U10 Participation teams to train on Fridays from 5.30-6.30pm at Hassall Park. Each of the ten teams had their own parent volunteer coach, supported by roving professional coaches. Specialist batting and bowling sessions were conducted for teams on a weekly rotation basis. I'd like to thank Daniel Caldwell, Brendan Lyon (brother of Australian Test player, Nathan Lyon) and Gavin Stuart for their Friday evening coaching, and Mark Hilton (U9 Coordinator) who liaised with the professional coaches regarding the weekly coaching programs. Based on the positive feedback received, we will continue the combined training format next season.

A feature of the Friday evening training sessions was the BBQ and canteen, with each team managing the BBQ and canteen sales on a weekly basis. Thank you to everyone who helped out during the season, especially Katherine Stevenson (U9 Coordinator) who purchased the BBQ and drink supplies each week, and worked tirelessly in making the new initiative so successful.



The 2014/15 season will also go down as one of the driest in recent years. We had no In2Cricket washouts – definitely the first time this has happened in at least six seasons. We only called one Friday night U9/10 training off out of 16 and barely any of the underage comp games were washed out. Most notably the weather held out for finals for us as well, a first for many seasons.

During the winter, the Club purchased 20 sun shelters with the Club's name and logo printed on them. The shelters were purchased using the \$4,000 donated to the Club by the Commonwealth Bank in 2013/2014 following some members appearing in the bank's cricket related TV commercials. I'd like to thank Katherine Stevenson for her fantastic efforts in organising the sun shelters. Due to the popularity of the shelters, a further seven more were purchased over the Christmas break, taking the Club's tally to 27 sun shelters.

On Friday 21st November, the third annual U9/U10 Twilight Big Bash social cricket / BBQ night was held at Hassall Park, and was a great success once again. We had 140 players involved, with highlights including a visit from the Sydney Sixers' mascot Syd Sixer, the use of flashing Zing bails, and lots of great cricket action. Parents enjoyed a picnic and the kids really enjoyed their cricket and especially the Zings light up bails (thank you to Zing International who provided several sets of bails to the club at nil cost, and to Rachel Scholefield, our Club Operations Manager, who collected the bails from Zing during a family visit to Adelaide). A massive thanks to Rachel Scholefield and Katherine Stevenson (U9 Age Manager) who worked tirelessly to make the night a success as well as Jacqui McKay who got the bar up and running, Cath Guilday (U11 Ponting and U12 Clarke) who helped behind the bar even without having a child participating on the night, along with Charmain Lorch (U9 Smith). Also, thank you to our stand-in 'Syd Sixer' (James Miller an ex St Ives player) who survived in the mascot suit despite the heat!



The Club continues to promote extra-curricular cricket activities for its players. In October, about 40 kids from our Club participated in the on-ground activities at North Sydney Oval and the SCG during the Matador BBQ Cup. Both afternoons were great opportunities for the kids. At the North Sydney game, Jono Cole (U12/13 Haddin) was lucky enough to be selected as flag bearer for the game. The highlight of the SCG afternoon was seeing and speaking with Chris Green, the former St Ives Junior, who was in the NSW team in the final. Twenty of our girls (and some of their brothers) were also lucky enough to participate in the on ground activities on the 3rd day of the Australia vs India Test at the SCG in January. They had a fabulous day decked out in pink for Jane McGrath day, and their photo even featured in the North Shore Times.

In October, some cricketers from our Club were lucky enough to be selected for the launch of the Milo In2Cricket and Milo T20 Blast program which was broadcasted live on Channel 9 during the Today show. A very early start to get to the event at 6:30am was worth the effort as they got to meet Michael Clarke, Nathan Lyon, Ellyse Perry and Meg Lanning.



We were also delighted to be invited by Cricket NSW for 20 kids to attend an Australian Team training session at the SCG prior to the Australia Day ODI against England. From all reports, the kids in attendance has a fantastic afternoon. We were also invited to bring along 17 lucky kids from the Club to be a part of the Anthem ceremony at the Australia Day ODI. Even though this match ended up being washed out, the kids had a fabulous time being invited to a press conference with Shane Watson and also being able to watch some of the Aussies warming up in the indoor nets right up close.



As if all of that wasn't enough, Cricket NSW also invited us to provide some kids to sell Toyota Good For Cricket raffle tickets with Mitch Marsh, Aaron Finch and James Faulkner down at Bondi Beach in December. The lucky kids who went along even got to play a spot of beach cricket with the Aussie stars, a very special day indeed. Thank you to everyone who contributed in selling and buying tickets for this raffle at very short notice. In what is a clear indication of the Club's fantastic support base, \$2,210 was raised in just over a week of ticket selling. Special mention

goes out to Alex Shaw, Chris Pearse and Max Kruger (and their mums) of U10 Smith, who all sold multiple books of tickets.



During the season we had a fantastic response to the sunglasses offer from Sally Atkins of Atkins Optometrist in Gordon, with over 200 pairs of Bolle sunglasses purchased by Club members at a significantly discounted price. Thank you to Sally (mother of Morgan Quan in U14 Johnson) for supporting the club with this initiative. Subject to Sally's agreement, I recommend we continue the sunglass initiative each season as part of our promotion of sun care awareness.



One initiative the Club successfully investigated and introduced this season was the concept of participation based, or Average Cricket, as an optional competition for Under 10 players. In U10 Participation Cricket, all players bat in pairs for four overs, with batters simply swapping ends when dismissed. The inaugural competition was held this season, with 12 teams from five clubs competing each weekend, of which St Ives had three teams. The U10 Participation format was a great success, and as a result, U11 Participation will be offered as an alternative to the traditional U11 Out means Out in 2015/2016.

During the season, the Club obtained a Liquor Licence, which allowed the Club to sell alcohol at the U9/U10 Big Bash in November, and during World Cup social nights in February. The Club is indebted to the support of the St Ives Rugby Club (especially Graeme Keenan) and St Ives Cricket Club (Gavin Wingfield and Bill White), in completing the Liquor Licence application process.

During the initial stages of the Liquor Licence application process, we learned that the Club is a co-signatory in a 20 year licence agreement with Ku-ring-gai Municipal Council to use Hassall Park Clubhouse and facilities, of which only ten years have expired. It should be noted that somewhere along the way, the knowledge of this agreement with Council had become lost to past and present Committee members. I'm glad to report that several copies of the Licence Agreement are now in safekeeping (The original documents were subsequently found in the Louise Smith Club Room at Hassall Park).

In the final stages of the season, we learned that a new stairway will be built in the Clubhouse to replace the existing stairs which are dangerously steep. I would like to thank Mr Jonathon O'Dea, the State Member for Davidson, for making the \$11,600 grant available as part of the Community Building Partnership program, and St Ives Rugby Club for applying for the grant, and for managing the construction of the new stairway (to be completed during 2015).

I would like to record my sincere thanks to everyone on the committee for their combined efforts in making the season such a success. The committee is comprised of a dedicated group of very capable parent volunteers, each of whom provides excellent service to the Club.

In addition to Michael Doran of McGrath Estate Agents, I would like to thank Triforce Sports in Gordon for offering our members 10% discount all year round, and Paul Byrom and Austin Morey from Action Indoor Sports at Mt Kuring-Gai for their generous donations for various Club events. We are also thankful to McDonalds in St Ives for donating vouchers for player of the day awards and Sydney Awards and Trophies in West Lindfield for the wonderful support they give us. The continued support from David Ford and Geoff Spotswood in providing us with coaching clinic prizes for our various Club functions has also been much appreciated.

An initiative which has been discussed at committee meetings for next season is that we will endeavor to give players more choices at registration time as to which division they would prefer to play in as well as participation v traditional in U10s and U11s. We will always, of course, take into account "play with" requests, but by giving players a choice of division as well we feel this will enable players to make more of a choice between the standard of cricket they would like to play and playing in a team purely on a friendship basis. When registering for next season, you will therefore see division choices when renewing your membership.

I would like to thank the Age Coordinators who collectively did a fantastic job in coordinating the many and varied activities required to keep a junior cricket Club running smoothly. Our Age Coordinators this year were Katherine Stevenson & Mark Hilton (U9), Brendon Morcom (U10), Julie Iyengar (U11), Matt Cole (U12), Lara Turner (U13), and Chris Skeggs (U14/15/16/17).

I would like to thank Dean Beeton who continued in his second season as the Club Coaching Coordinator. In particular, I would like to thank Dean for his help in managing the Club's ball machine bookings. Approximately six teams took advantage of the ball machine during their training sessions at Hassall Park.

I would like to pay particular thanks to our Club Operations Manager, Rachel Scholefield, who once again provided excellent and dedicated service to the Club, and often going well beyond the call of duty to ensure the smooth running of Club activities. Rachel has done a fantastic job in organising and promoting junior cricket in the St Ives district over the past three years, and we are grateful for her dedication and enthusiasm during that time.

During the season, Rachel informed the Committee that after three seasons, this was to be her last season as our Club Operations Manager. After a collective “Oh no!” moment, the Club advertised for a replacement Club Operations Manager in February, and received eight excellent applications. Following an interview process, which confirmed the high calibre of the applicants, the Club appointed Tracy Poulton (mother of Kieran in U10 Pattinson) as the new Club Operations Manager, effective from the AGM in April. Farewell Rachel. Welcome Tracy.



I would also like to thank Matt Cole, our Treasurer, who continued where he left off last season and managed the accounts with distinction. Matt’s diligence in budgeting, record keeping and Club accounting was exemplary, and ensured the Club ran at a small profit once again. A major step forward has been the introduction of online business banking, which was implemented (after more than 12 months in stalled attempts) in March 2015. On a personal note, the online banking is a major leap forward in convenience, and renders the counter signing of cheques at Gordon Station in the morning before work or in the evening at each other’s homes, a thing of the past.

A Treasurer’s work is never done, of course. Based on this year’s revenue exceeding \$150,000, and projected revenues in future years, we sought advice and have been advised to register for GST. The introduction of GST will pose new challenges next season, so any tax advisors amongst the parents are welcome to assist as we negotiate the transition to GST!

I would like to thank Anthony Ford for his continued efforts as Equipment Officer. Anthony did a great job checking the equipment in each kit prior to the start of the season, and ordering replacement items as required. This is Anthony’s last season at the Equipment Officer, and we are looking for someone to take over the reins next season.

I would like to thank Chris Skeggs, the Club’s delegate on the NSJCA committee for his time and effort in attending the monthly NSJCA meetings, and reporting back to the committee at our monthly meetings. Chris’ calm and reasoned feedback and suggestions throughout the season were greatly appreciated.

I would also like to thank Laura Critchley for volunteering to be our Club Newsletter editor this season, and for her skills in producing five excellent newsletters this season - copies of which are shown on the website (www.stivescricket.org.au).

Considering the extremely busy workload this season (despite my assurances that it wouldn't be too much of an impost on the family the second time round) I would particularly like to thank my wife, Jacqui, and our children, Tom, Charlie and Alice for their tremendous support and patience during the season.

Finally, as noted in previous years by past presidents, I would like to re-iterate that the single most important aspect for St Ives Junior Cricket Club's existence is for every player to participate and to have a 'fair go'. This requires a team of managers and coaches that can provide the environment for this to be possible.

I would like to thank every coach, manager, assistant, part-time assistant, scorer and umpire from every team for the time they take every week to make sure the players have the opportunity to participate. Without this approach there is no doubt the game would not be as widely enjoyed as it is.

As mentioned in past Reports, as a Club, 'we want to measure our success by how many kids comeback rather than by how many trophies we win'. With this in mind, I wish you all the best for your winter activities, and look forward to seeing you again next summer.

ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA

Awards are based on performances throughout the normal competition rounds. **Semi-Finals and Finals performances are not included for the purpose of determining awards.**

Perpetual awards are to be held by registered members of the Club only. Perpetual trophies shall be returned to the Club Registrar immediately a player ceases being a registered member of the Club, or at the end of the following season prior to Presentation Day.

JOHN WALSH MEMORIAL TROPHY (Club Champion): Awarded to the player who achieves the highest point score for the season (1 point per run scored, 10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or run-out, 5 points per assisted run-out). All age groups are eligible.

(Note: This trophy shall be held by a player once only; a player who has won the trophy once and scores the most points in a subsequent season will be acknowledged appropriately by the Club).

J. MAUNDER CUP: Presented to the player who scores the most runs in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players score equal runs, the award will be shared.

CHARLTON CUP: Presented to the player who takes the most wickets in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players take an equal number of wickets, the award will be shared.

BARRY GARROD TROPHY: Presented to the player who achieves the highest batting average in U11 and U12. A minimum aggregate of 200 runs must be scored for U12, and 150 for U11.

NEIL MARTZ TROPHY: Presented to the best performing wicket keeper for the season (total of catches and stumpings). All age groups are eligible.

PRESIDENT'S ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD: Presented to the player who is considered to have displayed the greatest dedication to the game, to the Club, and in developing their skills in the U10 and U11 competition. The Award is determined by the Club Executive on advice from each of the eligible team manager's recommendations.

STEVE DANIELS MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented to the player judged to be the most promising in the Club, ready to play in the senior competition. It has been traditional to select a player from the Club's most senior teams, and the Committee when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time. All aspects of the game are considered including batting, bowling, fielding, captaincy, sportsmanship and contribution to the Club.

JOHNSON FAMILY AWARD (*sponsored by Northern Districts Cricket Club*): Presented to the player judged to be the most promising playing in the U14/15 competition. The Committee, when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time, including performance in Representative cricket. In addition to a perpetual trophy the recipient receives a scholarship for the Northern District Cricket Academy for the following season.

ANNUAL AWARDS CRITERIA (cont)

STEVEN BIRD GIRLS' CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY: Awarded to the female player who achieves the highest point score for the season (1 point per run scored, 10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or runout, 5 points per assisted runout). All age groups playing Girls' only cricket are eligible.

100s, HAT TRICKS and 5 WICKETS IN A GAME: trophies are awarded to individuals who score 100 runs or take a hat trick or 5 wickets in a game during the season.

BATTING and BOWLING AWARDS: are made to the highest aggregate run scorers and wicket takers in each team. If players are equal on aggregate, the best average is awarded the trophy.
