PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2018-19 SEASON

The 2018-19 season was another successful season for the club and one that was made possible by the amazing efforts of the committee, the parents and our players.

It was also a season of change both at the administrative level where further changes were introduced by Cricket Australia to the junior pathways program and more importantly in the way we play the game following the reviews & reflections post the 2018 ball tampering scandal. The club continued to make progress with our strategic framework, achieving many of the planned milestones. On a personal level, the season was one of pride (of our continued progress) and of deeper connection (to the players, parents and the way we play our game at the club) which made my third year as the president of the club, a very satisfying and rewarding experience.

The season started with our annual open day where we were joined by the Sydney Sixers and their cricket carnival at Hassel Park in September 2018. We also welcomed our new platinum sponsors Godwin Ip from Mitchell Asset Management and Tal Eloss from One Group Property Advisory.

The games of the NSJCA competition started in October 2018 and continued until the finals in March 2019. In December, we raised money for underprivileged children through the Cricket Kindness Charity round. The parents and committee took some time out at the club social event in early March to celebrate the season and raise much needed funds for the club.

The season finale was the annual presentation day which was held on the 7th of April 2019 where we celebrated the many achievements of our talented players and enjoyed the company of the broader community of parents, grandparents, sponsors, past players & office bearers and our patron Chris Green.

On a personal level, I thoroughly enjoyed the time spent with our players and parents throughout the season whether it was chatting with parents at the Friday U9/U10 training sessions or watching the progress of our Master Blast players on Saturday mornings or umpiring my own son's U13 games on a Saturday or presenting awards for the select few players who played their 100th games for the club this season. These experiences reminded me of the great club we have built at St Ives and why we should make sure we continue to foster that community spirit within the club during this time of change.

In the report below, I have highlighted the key achievements of the 2018-19 season and the progress the club has made towards our strategic goals below.

1. Participation, performance and enjoyment of the game
2. Pathway to senior cricket

Players:

i. Cricket Australia junior cricket pathways program

This season, Woolworths was selected as the new sponsors of the In2Cricket and T20 Blast programs which were re-named as Junior Blast and Master Blast. SIJCC continued to offer a Saturday morning offering for players aged 5-8, through the Junior Blast program structure and two programs on Saturday mornings at Hassel Park and at Acron Oval (in partnership with Lindfield CC) through the Master Blast program. Further changes were introduced to the stage 1-3 programs for U9 to U17 formats. A huge thank you to Craig Johnson who helped with the coordination of Junior Blast program even though his daughter wasn't playing this season. A further thank you to Will Cheadle and Simon Gooderick for their support for the Master Blast programs.

ii. The club coaching strategy

The coaching strategy introduced a year ago was implemented again with no major changes to the offerings. However, the club faced numerous challenges to the effectiveness of the coaching offerings due to the dissolvent of Sydney Cricket Academy half way through the season. A huge thank you to Steve Bartlett (SIJCC Coaching Coordinator) who sourced additional coaching providers to support the U9-U10 and Girls cricket teams. This season the club continued to invest heavily in coaching and a total of \$48,443 was spent in various coaching initiatives.

iii. Development squads

The development squads introduced in 2018 continued with another group of players selected through a skills assessment process at the start of the season. The group of players from this squad played in the Kookaburra cup in Canberra.

iv. Maintain player numbers and engagement

The total number of registrations was down from the previous season but the engagement of the players and the parents remained very high. Our annual survey in April was an opportunity to review the season insights from our parents who told us that we are doing a good job with a few minor areas to improve. Our Net Promoter Score was +42 which again indicated the willingness of the vast majority of our parents to recommend the club to others.

v. Drive uptake of girls cricket.

This season SIJCC fielded three girls teams in U11 Perry, U11 Lanning and U13 Healy with a total of 25 girls playing cricket at the club within a dedicated girls team. The player numbers more than doubled compared to the season before

largely due to the pre-season free trial sessions and the various recruitment / promotion campaigns. Many more girls continued to play under the junior blast, master blast programs and some of the Stage 1-2 teams. A huge thank you to Gaby Lockyear and David McKay (girls cricket coordinators) who were both instrumental in engaging siblings & parents of current players and driving deeper engagement throughout the season. The club was very pleased to see former St Ives player Stella Campbell being awarded a Sydney Sixers WBBL contract this season.

People:

i. Social activities at the club and match-day parental engagement.

The canteen, the bar and coffee van provided a weekly social events on Friday evening training sessions and Saturday morning Master Blast sessions which was well supported by the parents. Many teams utilized the club BBQ's to make the game day experience a positive one and create a family friendly atmosphere.



The end of season social event was well supported by parents and the club is very grateful for Kirsty Pearce and KP & the Sunshine band for their live music at the event and for our club patron Chris Green who provided a backyard cricket game to be auctioned off at the event. A further thank you to Andrew Stevenson for being the MC and quiz master at the event.

ii. Engaged & high performing committee.

The core group of committee members again supported the various initiatives throughout the season and the club is keen to engage other parents who can contribute to the progress of the club and we are looking for additional volunteers to join the team next season. A very special thank you to Louise Smith for her unwavering commitment to the club and for the continued input within the committee. Thank you also to Adele Brennan for leading the transformation of our uniforms this season, for Chris Paulton and Andrew Stevenson for managing our equipment inventory efficiently and for reducing our equipment costs significantly, for Steve Bartlett for sourcing and managing the various coaching providers during a significant period of challenge, for Will Cheadle for being diligent with our finances and returning a surplus at the end of the season, for Mark Hilton for coordinating the Team Snap tool to effectively communicate with all our teams and engaging the Sydney Sixers to strengthen our partnership with them and to David Lane for

coordinating the grants application process this season.

Finally, a huge thank you to Katherine Stevenson who runs the operations of the club in an efficient and engaging manner that embody the spirit of the club every day.

iii. Accredited coaches and long term engagement.

The club continued to offer a refund on the registration fees for anyone who was completing the Cricket Australia Level 1 accreditation. A coach the coach session was run at the start of the season to equip new coaches to learn the basics and set themselves up for the season. As per the guidelines from Cricket Australia, each coach is now provided with a MyCricket ID number and they had to go through a “working with children” registration and on-line training at the start of the season thus strengthening the club’s commitment to a safe playing environment for our kids.

Places:

i. Overhaul facilities at Hassall Park.

The club has a goal of securing funding for the re-development of the double nets at Hassel park. Ku-ring-gai Council has done a provisional feasibility assessment and the club has already engaged with the CNSW facilities manager to identify a clear path towards completing the redevelopment within the next 3 years.

ii. Access ALL available facilities grants and increase internal fundraising.

The club has mapped out potential grants opening up this year and David Lane is leading the project to secure all available grant money this season. Additionally, the committee has plans for a structured fundraising effort towards a designated goal over the next 3 years which will be communicated later this year.

Partnerships:

I. Strategic partnerships with Northern Districts CC and Sydney Sixers.

- A. The partnership with the Sydney Sixers continued with a number of match-day opportunities for our players at BBL games. Also, the Sixers conducted their annual cricket carnival at the club opening day in September.
- B. The club continues to explore opportunities for players to forge a pathway to senior cricket at Northern Districts. Will Shortis and Nick Hook were part of the successful Northern Districts team who won the Green Shield this season. The new ND’s president Jeremy Hook attended the annual presentation day and I had the privilege of attending the NDs annual awards night.

II. Foster close links with Cricket NSW and NSJCA

- A. The club continue to work closely with CNSW to implement the changes to the pathways program; especially the changes to the junior blast and master blast programs. The feedback from our parents have been passed onto CNSW to incorporate in to next season's changes. Graeme Thom has continued to work closely with Cricket Australia in the development of the new score books and MyCricket scoring app.
- B. The club is well represented at the NSJCA executive with myself appointed as the Vice President of NSJCA for a second term and as the umpires and rules convener. David McKay was appointed again as the head of the dispensation committee.

I. Maintain close links with St Ives Wahroonga CC to create pathway to senior cricket.

The club continues to maintain close links with the St Ives Wahroonga senior club through regular executive meetings and through opportunities for U15 and U17 players to play in the 5th grade team.

II. Maintain close partnership with Ku-ring-gai Council.

The club maintained a close professional relationship with the council and has engaged them in the development of facilities at Hassell Park.

III. Create new opportunities for sponsorships with local businesses.

The club was very grateful for the generous sponsorship of Mitchell Asset Management and One Group Property Advisory who came onboard as platinum sponsors at the start of the season. Both Godwin Ip from Mitchell Asset Management and Tal Eloss from One Group Property Advisory have been regular attendees at club events and they have both started to forge closer contact with our parents. Engaging other local businesses as sponsorship partners remains a priority for the committee in the new season.

Promotion:

- i. Drive girls cricket promotion with Cricket NSW & Sydney sixers at local public schools.

A concerted effort with local schools and winter sports teams saw an increase in the girls cricket registrations this season. With free of charge pre-season tryouts and a structured coaching offering for girls, the club maintained strong engagement of girls this season.

- ii. Deliver match day / on ground entertainment experiences via Sydney Sixers and CNSW. A number of match day experiences were secured by the club for members including infield activities at BBL / WBBL games at the SCG. These represent once in a lifetime experience for the girls and boys who took part in them.



- iii. Increase traffic to the club Facebook page and additional user generated content. The Club Facebook page likes have increased to 325 this season which equates to additional 42 likes or a 15% increase vs. previous season.

- iv. Maximize the utilisation of MyCricket, TeamSnap and Website. TeamSnap was used by the majority of teams to communicate match day logistics, team selections and general team communications. A thorough evaluation of the investment into TeamSnap will be conducted in light of the improved functionality of MyCricket communication platform for the next season. The club website content was regularly updated and is now fully incorporated into the MyCricket platform thus providing a seamless connection to the Cricket Australia online resources.

- v. Multi-channel marketing integrating digital and traditional channels. The club continued to engage our parents through a variety of face to face channels including word of mouth. The local parent networks continue to provide a strong recruitment opportunity and advocacy for the club. These complement the revamped digital platforms which are now aligned to a consistent communication strategy to provide timely information to the players and parents.

2018/19 Individual Awards - Perpetual Awards

Awards are based on performances throughout the normal competition rounds. Semi-Finals and Finals performances are not included for the purpose of determining awards. Perpetual awards are to be held by registered members of the Club only. Perpetual trophies shall be returned to the Club Registrar immediately a player ceases being a registered member of the Club, or at the end of the following season prior to Presentation Day.

JOHN WALSH MEMORIAL TROPHY (Club Champion): Awarded to the player who achieves the highest point score for the season (0.1 point per run scored, 1 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or run-out, 0.5 points per assisted run-out). All age groups are eligible. (Note: This trophy shall be held by a player once only; a player who has won the trophy once and scores the most points in a subsequent season will be acknowledged appropriately by the Club).

J. MAUNDER CUP: Presented to the player who scores the most runs in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players score equal runs, the award will be shared.

CHARLTON CUP: Presented to the player who takes the most wickets in the season. All age groups are eligible. If two or more players take an equal number of wickets, the award will be shared.

BARRY GARROD TROPHY: Presented to the player who achieves the highest batting average in U11 and U12. A minimum aggregate of 200 runs must be scored for U12, and 150 for U11.

NEIL MARTZ TROPHY: Presented to the best performing wicket keeper for the season (total of catches and stumpings). All age groups are eligible.

PRESIDENT'S ENCOURAGEMENT AWARD: Presented to the player who is considered to have displayed the greatest dedication to the game, to the Club, and in developing their skills in the U10 and U11 competition. The Award is determined by the Club Executive on advice from each of the eligible team manager's recommendations.

STEVE DANIELS MEMORIAL TROPHY: Presented to the player judged to be the most promising in the Club, ready to play in the senior competition. It has been traditional to select a player from the Club's most senior teams, and the Committee when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time. All aspects of the game are considered including batting, bowling, fielding, captaincy, sportsmanship and contribution to the Club.

JOHNSON FAMILY AWARD: (sponsored by Northern Districts Cricket Club): Presented to

the player judged to be the most promising playing in the U14/15 competition. The Committee, when making the selection takes into account the player's history and performance over a reasonable period of time, including performance in Representative cricket. In addition to a perpetual trophy the recipient receives a scholarship for the Northern District Cricket Academy for the following season.

STEVEN BIRD GIRLS' CHAMPIONSHIP TROPHY: Awarded to the female player who achieves the highest point score for the season (1 point per run scored, 10 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or runout, 5 points per assisted runout). All age groups playing Girls' only cricket are eligible.

AGE GROUP CHAMPIONS: Awarded to the player who achieves the highest point score for the season in the John Walsh Memorial trophy tradition. Awarded to the player who achieves the highest point score for the season (0.1 point per run scored, 1 points per wicket, catch, stumping, or run-out, 0.5 points per assisted run-out). All divisions in that age group are eligible.

100s, HAT TRICKS and 5 WICKETS IN A GAME: trophies are awarded to individuals who score 100 runs or take a hat trick or 5 wickets in a game during the season.

BATTING and BOWLING AWARDS: are made to the highest aggregate run scorers and wicket takers in each team. These stats are taken from MyCricket. If players are equal on aggregate, the best average is awarded the trophy.

SPIRIT OF CRICKET AWARDS: is awarded to a player in each junior team who has played the game with a sense of passion and willingness to improve. This award is given to a player that does not necessarily have the most wickets runs or catches.

U9's/U10/U11/Girls PARTICIPATION AWARDS: Each U9-11 Stage 1 and Girls teams are awarded a participation trophy.

OTHER AWARDS: Medallions are awarded to all members of Minor Premiers and Premiership winning teams by NSJCA. The Club also awards Minor Premier caps to each team member of Minor Premier teams (teams finishing on top of the table before the finals begin). The 75 cap is given to a player to commemorate the 75 matches or more they have played with the St Ives. The 100 game trophy was introduced this season. This is awarded to players who have played 100 games with SIJCC.
